

Podcast about Life in Colonial America (1700 - 1750)

Overview:

For this assignment, you will research and create a podcast episode about a key event or the lifestyle and culture of colonial America during the years 1700–1750. This is an opportunity to practice your podcasting skills while exploring the social, cultural, and historical aspects of life during this time period.

Instructions:

1. Research Your Assigned Topic:

- Each student will be assigned a specific key event or cultural aspect from 1700-1750.

- Write a brief script or outline for a **1-2 minute summary** of your topic.
- Record your summary using the podcasting software, focusing on clear and engaging delivery.
- Edit the recording to remove pauses, filler words, and to improve the overall sound quality.
- Optionally, add music or sound effects to make your podcast more dynamic and engaging.

3. Submit Your Recording:

- Export your final podcast episode and submit it through our platform before next week's class.

Podcasting Tips:

- **Stay focused:** Keep your summary concise and centered on the most important aspects of your event or lifestyle topic.
- **Practice your script:** Read through your script multiple times to ensure a smooth, clear delivery.

- **Engage your listeners:** Use music, sound effects, or creative storytelling techniques to make your podcast interesting.

Evaluation Criteria:

- **Content Accuracy:** Your understanding and clear explanation of the historical event or lifestyle topic.
- **Podcasting Skills:** Recording quality, editing, and sound production.
- **Creativity:** The use of sound effects, music, or creative narrative techniques.

Possible Topics:

- Colonial trade and the Triangle Trade system
- Religious movements such as the Great Awakening
- Life in colonial Boston, Philadelphia, or Williamsburg
- Education and apprenticeship in colonial towns
- Native American relations with colonists
- The daily life of enslaved people in colonial America
- The role of women in colonial households and society
- Innovations in colonial architecture and settlement planning
